## Tasks and Expectations:

We are looking for an excellent academic candidate to represent the Christian Anthropology and Social Ethics professorship in its full scope in research and teaching. The successful candidate will exhibit a distinctive social ethics research profile, enabling them to contribute well-founded academic input regarding current social challenges. Applicants should have proven expertise in individual fields of the subject.

Teaching in the various Catholic Theology degree programs is to be carried out in German; a readiness to offer English-language courses is desirable. We expect thematically open, methodically diverse, and interdisciplinary courses to be offered as well as the willingness to contribute to the development of innovative forms of teaching and learning. Furthermore, the professorship involves teaching in the field of philosophy within the context of theological studies and supplies courses for other faculties (currently for Law, Management and Economics).
